This step concerns itself with humility. We should pause here to consider what humility is and what the practice of it can do for us. Indeed, the attainment of greater humility is the foundation principle of each AA Twelve Steps, for without some degree of humility no alcoholic can stay sober. Nearly all AA's have found too, that unless they develop much more of this precious quality than may be required just for sobriety, they still haven't much chance of becoming truly happy. Without it, they cannot live with too much purpose, or in adversity, be able to summon the faith that can meet any emergency. Humility, as a word and as an ideal, has a very bad time of it in our world. Not only is the word intensely disliked, many people haven't even a nodding acquaintance with humility as a way of life. Much of the everyday talk we hear, and a good deal of what we read, highlights man's pride in his own achievements. Shortcomings and defects will be good because it will change your life and may make you happy.

The newcomer in AA is told, and soon realizes for himself, that his humble admission of powerlessness over alcohol is the first step toward liberation from the paralyzing grip.

So it is that we first see humility as a necessary but barest beginning. To get completely away from aversion to the idea of being humble, to gain a vision of humility as something to be desired for itself, takes most of us a long, long time. A whole lifetime geared towards self-centeredness cannot be set in reverse all at once. Rebellion dogs our every step.

When we finally admitted without reservation that we were powerless over alcohol, we are apt to breathe a sigh of relief, saying, "Well thank God that's over." I never have to go through that again.




June Edition Word Search KEY

TRADITIONS CHECKLIST FROM THE AA GRAPEVINE



These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through September 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many AA groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion.

Practice These Principles...

Tradition Seven: Every AA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.

- 1. Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?
 - 2. Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?
 - 3. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
 - 4. Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?

Open Letter to Maui AA Fellowship

7th Tradition Support Continues to Drop for Maui AA Intergroup

Aloha Maui AA members,

I'm a grateful member of AA on Maui, and in recent years have served as Maui Intergroup Treasurer for 4 years, Secretary for 4 years, and have been Maui Intergroup's tax accountant for about 10 years.

I want to alert you to a concerning trend that we've experienced for the past several years. Our 7th Tradition contributions have gone down 28% since 2017, and 41% since 2019. In dollar amounts, that's \$6,054 down since 2017 and \$8,821 down since 2019.

Here are the numbers for the past 5 full years:

As you can see, there was some recovery in 2021, but 2022 contributions were down again. As of April 2023, Intergroup is operating at a slight loss, even with Intergroup's continuing to trim its expenses. 2022 Maui Intergroup expenses –primarily, a modest wage paid to our part-time Central Office Manager and below-market rent for our office – were still lower than pre-COVID expenses, yet group contributions fell far short in covering those expenses. Most of our services continue to be provided by volunteers. For the past several years, Maui Intergroup has not been able to fill all of its positions, so the work has been done by fewer people. Our number of Intergroup Representatives has also shrunk.

Even with most of our meetings now being back to "in-person," our group contributions are still much lower than pre-Pandemic. There seem to be many reasons -- the rents have gone up for many meeting locations, certain meetings being required to provide insurance to the meeting place, in-person attendance still a bit lower than before, groups setting up higher prudent reserves, Treasurers sending in the 7th Tradition split more slowly than before, and many other reasons.

Let's keep supporting Maui Intergroup, our Maui Districts, Hawaii Area 17, and AA World Services to carry the message and to serve our members. If you're able to give extra when the basket goes around, any amount is helpful. And please encourage your group to regularly send 7th Tradition splits, if it's able to. And a big Mahalo to the members who contribute to Maui AA Intergroup online each month to provide an extra boost to support our services on-island!
