STEP FOUR – Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.

When I first recognized I was an alcoholic and admitted that I needed help it was with trepidation that I anticipated doing STEP FOUR. I heard many of your fears rise up around you doing your inventory and I wondered if there wasn't an easier, softer way.

I thought surely I could get by with the most recent and public humiliations and let sleeping dogs lay. But did I want to risk being in that incomprehensible demoralized place again? No, never again. Did I want to be free of those things that drove me to drink? If yes, then to what lengths was I willing to go? Willing to be embarrassed & ashamed? Willing to

lose the friends I was making in this fellowship?

This step written out as outlined in the BB let me see how self-centered fear, neediness and false pride drove me to drink. Not getting what I thought I deserved or



losing what I had caused me to be jealous and wary of you. Trying to fill the God-shaped hole in my soul with people caused me to place unreasonable demands on unsuspecting friends. Playing the big shot and know-it-all separated me from those who were willing to be of help if I would have only asked.

This step for me became a treasure hunt. I had to hunt through the muck and mire and crud that were my drinking life for the treasure that was the real Cathy. This step was an expression of faith & trust. I had faith in a Higher Power Whom I had turned my will & my life over to in STEP 3. Trusting that He would turn my defects of character into something for good was what I was doing when putting pen to paper.

Freedom is what I was gifted with. This step means freedom for those brave and courageous enough to go treasure hunting in a dark and treacherous place. Have you found the treasure that is you, yet?

A.A.'s Seventh Tradition states: "Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions." This means that only A.A. members contribute financially to A.A. — and even

A.A. members are limited in the amount they can contribute. This keeps A.A. free of outside influences that might divert us from our primary purpose — to help the alcoholic who still suffers. The

amount of the contribution is secondary to the spiritual connection that unites all groups around the world

Where Money and Spirituality Mix

Members celebrate sobriety by giving time, energy and money in support of carrying the A.A. message. Members assure that group expenses are paid by voluntarily putting money into the basket passed at each meeting. Contributions support the group and A.A. worldwide. Contributions ensure that:

- Professionals get correct information about A.A.
- Lone A.A. members get letters

TRADITION FOUR:

Tradition Four

"Each group should be autonomous except in matters effecting other groups or A.A. as a whole."

I liked the traditions from the very beginning. I had no idea what A.A. was all about. I knew I needed to quit drinking and A.A. was the place people like me went. I knew A.A. was a 12---step program, but I did not know anything about what those step were. The 12 Steps and the 12 Tradition banners were hanging on the wall my very first meeting. In between crying and shaking I could raise my head for a few minutes during each meeting and read those banners. The traditions gave me some idea how this new A.A. group functioned. This was important to me because I was so scared about getting sober.

The A.A. group can do what it wants. The long form of tradition four says the group is responsible to no other authority then it's own conscience. The group holding the meeting cannot interfere with another A.A group. The group holding the meeting should not get any interference from another A.A. group. Great. It's really balanced and simple to understand. I can just go to another meeting if I don't like this meeting. Tradition four informs me not all meetings will be alike. I meet a wide variety of formats and characters as I attend a lot of different meetings. It's fun to try different groups. The great fellowship represented by the A.A. members keeps things really interesting. The A.A. message of experience, strength, and hope is amplified when it is repeated from so many diverse members of the fellowship.

A.A. literature is the same everywhere. All A.A. literature and A.A. materials are published by A.A. World Services, Inc. The A.A. program is a common basic textbook used by the groups. Tradition Four lets me know the group holding the meeting functions without any central authority. This helped me relax in the beginning when everything is new and scary. All the big books on the table, sober people praying together, etc. I needed to know that there wasn't some A.A. leader somewhere calling the shots and trying to brainwash me. But the tradition also lets me know that my group should not take any action that would affect A.A. as whole. To me this means the good reputation of this group of drunks should be guarded as something very special.
