I remember when my children were young and I was in couple's counseling, something that the therapist said that really stuck with me.

She said "If you want to develop a closer relationship with each other you must spend enough quantity of time together so that the quality moments can happen. Quality moments don't happen with very little time together." She explained that if my husband and I only communicating over day-to-day tasks and duties with no true heart to heart sharing then our relationship would not be able to grow and deepen. She was right and we got divorced.

If I apply this same idea of creating enough quantity of time to have quality moments to my con-

Dr John DeMartini once said "if you want to know a person's values don't listen to just what they say, instead look at where they spend their time and mon-



and then you will ey know." I now meditate and pray every day because I value my conscious contact with God.

Those moments sitting quietly with God took a while to unfold in my life. When I nection with my Higher first came to AA, I was angry with and felt forgotten by the God of my understanding. I felt sure the entire universe was against me and I was the victim of life.

My sponsor asked me if I believed in God. I curtly answered "Yes but, I don't think God cares anything about me."

Little did I know that I would discover a loving and caring Higher Power that can and does support and sustain me through anything. How this remarkable did change happen? It was through working the steps!

By the time I got to step 11 I was finally ready to commit to spending time every day in quiet and meditation. I had already been practicing prayer and asking to know God's will in my life.

In fact, I memorized the Third Step prayer, the Seventh Step prayer and the St Francis prayer (the Eleventh step prayer). I was saying these prayers daily but I still felt I had more of an intellectual connection with God rather than a heart-to-heart communication.

Through regular meditation my mind began to be tamed like a wild horse that was ready to team up with their trainer rather than to fight any more. I could gradually feel a comforting presence sitting in my heart. A beautiful white light greeted me in my third eye (between my brows) and my breath slowed to a comfortable, deep rhythm. This stillness is in direct contrast to the pace I live my life. I am often booked up back-to-back and jumping from one commitment to the next. I have ADD and PTSD. Being still is not easy for me. But while I am in meditation, I can feel my relationship with the God of my understanding (that I like to call "Spirit of the Universe") I have learned to trust this powerful source of inspiration, guidance and love in my life.

Unlike my marriage that ended in divorce from lack of time together I bring my Higher Power with me wherever I go. I check in regularly for God's will for me and I take time to meditate and feel the powerful invisible sense of the great universal spirit within me. I value my connection to the Divine.

A Tool for Reading

Alcoholics Anonymous

This is A.A. General Service Conference-approved literature

The Plain Language Big Book is a tool to help readers understand the book Alcoholics Anonymous, which was first published in 1939. This new book is designed so that the A.A. Twelve Step program of recovery from alcoholism may be easily understood and accessible by all people who have a desire to stop drinking.

Members of A.A. fondly call the original book *Alcoholics Anonymous* "the Big Book." It is the basic text of the A.A. program. The *Plain Language Big Book* has been written to present the original ideas and same spiritual message of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*.

This new text is not intended to replace the much beloved Big Book. Rather, the *Plain Language Big Book* is a book crafted over several years by A.A. members and publishing professionals to support alcoholics on the path to recovery. The book is intended to help people who have a problem with alcohol gain access to A.A.'s lifesaving message.

For years, A.A. members have expressed a need for a *Plain Language Big Book*. Based on the shared experience of A.A. members, some people may not have regular contact with other A.A. members to help them understand the A.A. program of recovery and the specific vocabulary as it is used throughout the original book *Alcoholics Anonymous*. Other people have a hard time reading, especially books that were written long ago. This *Plain Language Big Book* is written in simpler language to support readers in their recovery.

This book is published in accordance with Advisory Actions passed by substantial unanimity of the General Service Conference (GSC) of Alcoholics Anonymous. In 2021, the 71st GSC advised that this book be developed. Progress reports, then sample chapters were reviewed at the 72nd and 73rd GSCs. The final draft of the *Plain Language Big Book* was reviewed and approved by substantial unanimity at the 74th GSC, in April 2024. This process and outcome adopts this text as Conference Approved Literature.

The Plain Language Big Book covers the core content of what is the "abridged version" (the edition without personal stories) of the original Big Book.

Readers are also encouraged to seek out the current edition of the book *Alcoholics Anonymous* and meet with A.A. members to support their own individual paths of recovery from alcoholism.

The Plain Language Big Book is A.A. General Service Conference-approved literature.

TRADITION ELEVEN:

"OUR PUBLIC RELATIONS POLICY IS BASED ON ATTRACTION RATHER THAN PROMOTION; WE NEED ALWAYS MAINTAIN PERSONAL ANONYMITY AT THE LEVEL OF PRESS, RADIO AND FILMS."

Tradition 11 protects our anonymity in public spaces.

This principle has been essential to AA's success and unity, emphasizing respect, humility, and the importance of shared experiences rather than individual personalities.

The tradition encourages members to share AA's message by living their recovery, rather than through public announcements or publicity that could spotlight individuals. This "attraction rather than promotion" approach helps people find AA naturally, drawn by the visible changes in others' lives rather than by external advertising. By maintaining anonymity in public media, members protect their privacy and reduce stigma, while also preventing AA from becoming associated with any particular member's personal story. This respect for anonymity fosters equality within AA, where no member is held above another.

The anonymity of Tradition 11 underscores that AA is a fellowship, not a platform for individuals. It reminds members to stay focused on their primary purpose of helping each other, a foundation that continues to attract newcomers in search of recovery.

Through Tradition 11, AA maintains a welcoming, safe space where anyone suffering from alcoholism can find support, confidentiality, and hope.
